1 can Cream of Mushroom soup

‡ cup milk

1 egg, beaten

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup grated cheese

½ cup mayonnaise

½ cup butter, melted Ritz crackers

Directions

Place broccoli in the bottom of a dish. Pour the rest on top. Melt $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter. Pour over mixture, and crumble Ritz crackers being sure to cover entire surface. Bake at 350° for 45 minutes.

Cheesy Crockpot Potatoes

Ingredients

4 large baking potatoes

2 cups cheddar cheese, divided

1 (10.5 oz) Cream of Chicken Soup

1 tsp garlic power

2 tsp kosher salt

 $\frac{1}{2}$ - 1 tsp black pepper (depending on taste)

½ cup dice onion

1 cup sour cream or 6 oz softened cream cheese

Directions

Add all the ingredients (using only 1 cup of the cheese) to a large bowl and stir together to combine. Spray the insert of a 4-6 quart slow cooker and add the potato mixture, spreading out in an even layer.

Cover and cook on high 3-4 hours or on low 6-7 hours. Stir the potatoes once during cooking if possible.

During the last 30 minutes of cooking, add the remaining cheese in an even layer to the top of potatoes. Cover and let cheese melt during the last 30 minutes of cooking time.

Potatoes can be kept on the "warm" setting if serving from the crockpot.

Note: recipe is easily doubled
