

## RMMA Region 1 Rally, Santa Fe, NM June 2022

We had planned to stay in the parking lot of Star Brothers Brewing Company in Albuquerque. If you are traveling through ABQ and need a place to overnight SBBC has a large level dirt lot that will fit about ten rigs. Calling ahead or advanced arrangements is required. Getting to SBBC is easy, it is located a block or so behind Cracker Barrell in ABQ just off I-25 North. We enjoyed dinner and beer at SBBC.

• We departed ABQ the following morning, arriving at Santa Fe Skies RV Park. Checking in was quick and easy and we found the park staff to be friendly and very helpful. The park has a nice walking path around the park decorated with remarkably interesting iron artwork and farm/construction implements from times gone by. The office and group gathering area, both inside and outside, are nice and a full kitchen was available for our use. The dog park is large and has a covered sitting area. Wi-Fi is free but a little spotty. Over air TV was good with over fifty channels.

• On June 13, thirty-nine years ago, I was blessed to take Cindy as my wife. We celebrated our 39<sup>th</sup> anniversary with the Parmans in Santa Fe. We enjoyed and wonderful meal at Gabriel's Restaurant located about ten miles north of Santa Fe on Hwy 84. We enjoyed a New Mexico southwest prepared dinners with fresh guacamole made at our table.

• We arrived a couple of days before the start of the rally. One night was enjoyed grilling pork chops with a side of fresh corn on the cob. We took a walk at the Santa Fe rail yard and walked enjoyed the many fresh produce vendors set up there.

• It you are in ABQ you can now ride the train called the Rail Runner to downtown Santa Fe for a day trip. Cost a roundtrip day ticket is \$2-\$11 depending on where you pickup the train in ABQ and the discounts being offered that day.

• After arriving at the park, we did run into a couple of problems, as we all do owning RVs. The park provided us with a mobile RV repair service, Rusty Wrench, 505-470-8884,

• Prior to the rally starting several of us gathered at the Santa Fe Brewing Co., just a mile from the RV park to enjoy a late lunch and some locally brewed beer.

• The Region 1 Rally started on Wednesday evening with a heavy hors d'oeuvres and a gift drawing. Brian and Vallarie provided homemade meatballs! There were twenty-five coaches representing all parts of Region 1. Three of the coaches were new to FMCA, RMMA, or Region 1. The Massey's travelled to Taos and Red River, NM after the Region 1 Rally in Santa Fe, staying about a week at both locations. They stayed at the Monte Bello RV Park in Taos. A small park, about 30-35 spaces a few miles north and west of Taos. The park is just a few years old. The park has a very nice 1.25-mile walking path that is open to off leash walking of your dog. While in Taos the Massey's visited the Rio Grande Gorge Bridge, the Taos Ski Area, the Taos Square, and the community of Arroyo Seco. They also took a half-day rafting trip on the Rio Grande! Unfortunately, the Taos Pueblo was closed to visitors. In Red River they stayed at the Road Runner RV Park. The park is large with a beautiful mountain setting with the Red River running through the park. Cindy found two wine tasting rooms in Red River and enjoyed several wine tastings and Bill enjoyed a glass of Port. The first few days in Red River were very rainy, but the area needed the rain, and it did help put out the fires near Las Vegas, NM. Because of the rain the Forest Service opened most of the National Forest to visitors in NM. With the opening of the NF, Cindy and Bill took the Jeep for a little offroading visiting Greenie Peak with an elevation of 11,148 feet and Goose Lake at an elevation of 11, 630 feet.


