There was an army base there at the time, Camp Furlong, who responded that night to the invasion. Though it started as an act of war, it has developed into a celebration of the culture of this area. The museum at the State Park is one of the best documenting this event and the ramifications it had into our preparedness for World War I. This was also the first time the "Flying Jenny" was used in a military scouting position.

The Fiesta had Mexican dancing, music, and food, and lots of fun!

• On Sunday, we headed across the boarder to Palomas, Mexico. We park our cars at the Duty store on the American side and walk across into Mexico. Our first stop was the Farmacia, and then off to the Pink Store for good food...and free margaritas!

• Just after we had crossed back into America and were walking to the check point, Merle fell across a low bench area and into a gulley below. (I swear the margaritas had nothing to do with it.)
